

LAMBERT, Edward

1716 to 1737 Tenant to Hoskins for Henden farm mostly in Sundridge and Brasted parishes.

LANE, Mary

1768 (spinster). Married John Leigh. Witnesses: John Leigh, Elizabeth Weller?

LANGRIDGE, Joseph, of Chiddingstone, miller, yeoman, wife Mary

1749 to 1788 Occupied Bassetts Mill and Birchcope in Chiddingstone and Cowden, tenant of heirs of Bassett.

1749 Daughter Ann. She married William Dalton. Died 1804, aged 56 n(monument in churchyard).

1750 Son William

1752 Daughter Mary

1754 Borsholder of Frienden borough.

1755 Daughter Sarah and son Joseph. In 1781 Sarah Langridge (spinster) married John Wallis. Witnesses: George Dulake, Susanna Langridge.

1758 Daughter Elizabeth

1760 Daughter Susanna who witnessed marriage of William Langridge and Margaret Packham in 1776. In 1781 she witnessed marriage of John Wallis and Sarah Langridge. In 1784 she witnessed the marriage between Edward Brookes of Penshurst and Hannah Heath.

1779 Witnessed will of John Everest.

1783 to 1785 He sent bills to the overseers for flour supplied for the poor or the workhouse.

1785 Served on Petty Jury (Quarter Sessions)

1785 The parish paid him George Longley's rent £2-10s. (continued)

1787 Death of wife Mary, aged 66 (monument in churchyard)

1794 Death, aged 72. Will (PCC). To son Joseph messuages at Rendsley Hoath called Turners. Son William. Daughters Mary Pearless, Ann Dalton of Hayes, Sarah Wallis of Cowden, Elizabeth Gainsford of Cowden, and Susannah **aged less than 21 in 1789.**

Problem

LANGRIDGE, William. Son of Joseph Langridge, above. Wife Margaret

1776 Married (bachelor) Margaret Packham of Tonbridge. Witnesses: William Piggott, Susannah Langridge.

1812 Death, aged 62. (monument in churchyard).

LANGRIDGE, Mary

1761 Married Thomas Parkhurst. Witness: Elizabeth Collyer

LANGRIDGE, William, wife Elizabeth

1765 (bachelor, of Offham) Married Mary Crowhurst. Witness: John Oliver

1766 Daughter Mary who died in 1773

1768 Son William who died in 1771 (infant)

1769 Daughter Sarah

1771 Son Robert

1773 Daughter Elizabeth. In 1785 she was kept by Robert Heasman for 49 weeks at 1s a week.

1775 Daughter Ann who died in 1785. Mr Moyce made her a coffin 8s. Parish paid her burial fees 4s 9d.

1777 Son George

1784 His girl kept by Mr Roses for a year at 1s a week. His boy kept by Joseph Potter one year at 1s a week.

1784 His rent for two years paid by the parish to Mr Beeby £6. 1785 He received 4s relief. (continued)

LANGRIDGE, John, wife Winny

1771 John Langridge, bachelor, married Winny Ashdown. Witness: John Ashdown

1772 Death of John Langridge

1775 Winny Langridge, widow, married William Smith, widower. Witnesses: Elizabeth Page, John Ashdown

LANGRIDGE, George

1775 Witnessed the marriage of John Hoar and Sarah Holford.

1777 Witnessed marriage of Nicholas Nightingale and Susannah Kemp

LATTER, William, of Offham, wife Mary

1765 William Latter, bachelor, married Mary Crowhurst. Witness: John Oliver

LAWRENCE, James, wife Elizabeth

1734 Daughter Elizabeth who died the same year.

1734 Death of son John.

1735 Daughter Susanna

1737 Son James

1739 Daughter Elizabeth

LEA, Thomas, wife Sarah

1736 Death of widow Sarah

LEE, James

1737 Death

LEE, James, wife Mary

1733 James Lee the younger married Mary Carrot

1734 Daughter Katherine

1742 Death of Mary, wife of James Lee

LEE, James, wife Hetty

1760 James Lee of Penshurst married Hetty Keyes of Chiddingstone by licence at Penshurst

LEE, Thomas, wife Jane

1741 Death of Thomas Lee and Jane his wife

LEE, Mary

1742 Death

LEE, John, wife Elizabeth

1734 John Lee, bachelor, of Chiddingstone, married Elizabeth Bannister, widow, of Chiddingstone, at the Fleet.

1735 Daughter Elizabeth

1735 John and Elizabeth with daughter Elizabeth acknowledged by Chiddingstone to be inhabitants of Sevenoaks.

1737 Son John. Possible death 1740

1739 Son Thomas. Possible death 1761

1743 Son William

1757 Death

LEE, William

1762 Death

LEE, Sarah, widow

1746 Death

LEE, William, wife Elizabeth

1757 Witnessed marriage of Richard Knight and Hannah Tibbalds

1763 William Lee married Elizabeth Elwood. Witness : Barnard Martin

1765 Daughter Elizabeth

1768 Son John

LEE, Sarah

1768 Death

LEE, Robert, of Leigh. Wife Rebecca

1762 Robert Lee married Rebecca Jacob. Witness; Thomas Jacob.

LEE, Mary, widow of William Lee who died in 1733

1734 to 1752 Mary Lee was licensed at the "Chequer".

1739 She seems to have bought Haycroft from William and Robert Cronk.

1750 Mary Lee for the Haycroft with a tenement and barn lately erected. Also for the "Chequer". (manor of Millbrook).

1768 Death

1771 Mary Lee had alienated the "Chequer" to John Eastwood.

LEE, widow

1780 Death

LEGGATT, Ann of Richmond, widow, sister of William and Thomas Woodgate

1728 to 1739 Owner of Lower Hill (Hilly Field) and Chiddingstone-Cobham manor house

1739 She sold Lower Hill and Chiddingstone-Cobham manor house to Henry Streatfeild for £200.

LEICESTER, John, Earl of

1707 to 1737 Owned Marshope Mead, part of Doubletons farm.

LEICESTER, Joscelin, Earl of

1740 to 1743 Owned Marshope Mead, part of Doubletons farm.

LEIGH, Robert, wife Ann

1735 Son Robert

1738 Daughter Elizabeth

1740 Son John who died in 1742?

1743 Son Edward

1746 Son George who died in 1767

1750 Daughter Mary

1752 Daughter Ann

1759 Daughter Sarah

1769 Death of Ann Leigh

LEIGH, Ann

1778 Ann Leigh, spinster, married William Boakes. Witness: Thomas Shorey

LEIGH, John, carpenter, wife Sarah

1741 Acknowledged by Edenbridge to Chiddingstone.

1743 Son John . He witnessed marriage of Mary Leigh and Edward Mitchell in 1780.
Brother-in-law of James Blackwell. He had a son Edward

1744 Daughter Sarah.

1747 Son Henry who died in 1758

1749 Daughter Elizabeth She witnessed the marriage of Mary Leigh and Edward Mitchell in 1780. In 1782 Elizabeth Leigh married James Blackwell. Witnesses: Mary Leigh, John Palmer

1750 Son Edward . Brother-in-law of James Blackwell. He died in 1804 aged 53
(monument in churchyard)

1752 Occupied a messuage called Tyehaw adjoining to Tyehurst Green, tenant of Streatfeild. (Particulars of Streatfeild estate).

1756 Daughter Mary. Mary (spinster) married Edward Mitchell in 1780. Witnesses: John Leigh, Elizabeth Leigh. In 1782 she witnessed marriage between James Blackwell and Elizabeth Leigh.

1757 Death of Sarah Leigh

1757 Executor of Thomas Wilds of Edenbridge, carpenter.

1758 Death

LEIGH, Elizabeth

1761 Base daughter Rebekah

LEIGH, Robert, junior, wife Rebekah

1762 Son John (baptised at Leigh)

1763 Daughter Ann

1765 Daughter Sarah

1767 Daughter Susanna

1784 Death of Robert Leigh (**this one?**). Thomas Moyce made a coffin for him 9s. Parish contributed 5s towards his burial.

LEIGH, John

1768 Witnessed marriage of John Leigh and Mary Lane

LEIGH, John, wife Mary

1779 to 1794 (junior) Occupied Tyehaw House, tenant of Streatfeild. (Streatfield rent book).

1764 Court of Tyhurst manor summoned at the Pound Oak which is next to J Leigh's property.

1768 John Leigh, bachelor, married Mary Lane. Witnesses: John Leigh, Elizabeth Weller?

1770 Son John

1772 (junior) Son Henry

1774 (junior) Daughter Mary who died the same year (infant)

1775 (junior) Daughter Sarah

1777 (junior) Daughter Elizabeth

1780 (junior) Daughter Ann

1780 (junior) Witnessed will of Thomas Goodhugh

1783 (junior) Son Edward

1785 (junior) Daughter Mary

LEIGH, Ann

1776 Base son William

LEIGH, Edward, son of John Leigh, wife Elizabeth

1782 to 1801 Licensed victualler at the Castle Inn, tenant of Streatfeild.

1782 Edward Leigh, bachelor, married Elizabeth Page. Witnesses: Sarah Page, James Blackwell.

1783 Daughter Elizabeth

1784 to 1785 He sent a number of bills to the overseers for necessities for the poor. He supplied necessities for William Smith stricken with smallpox 7s 11d.

1785 The overseers spent 16s 6d going to Tonbridge on his account.

1785 He supplied meat to the workhouse 7s 7½d. Also leather 9s 3d. he was paid £1-15s for fetching three loads of coals for the workhouse. He supplied liquor at certain meetings of the parish officers 16s 6d.

LEIGH, Edward, labourer, wife Elizabeth

1785 Settlement examination. He had intruded into Edenbridge which led to a dispute between Edenbridge and Chiddingstone. Edward Leigh had served Mr John Avis in Edenbridge. Did this gain him a settlement in Edenbridge?

1750 William Letter married Elizabeth Hall

1776 Death

1781 Death of Elizabeth Letter

LETTINGTON, William.

1755 Witnessed marriage of Thomas Humphreys and Ann Medhurst

LEVET, John, junior, wife Elizabeth

1738 Son Edward who married Mary Glover in 1769

1741 Son John who witnessed the marriage of Edward Levite in 1769

1742 Son Robert

1744 Occupied a house in Rennesley Hoath belonging to Mary Arnold.

1745 Daughter Rebecca

1747 Daughter Elizabeth who died in the same year

1747 Death of Elizabeth Levet

1762 Death

LEVET, LEVITE, Edward, wife Mary

1769 Edward Levite, bachelor, married Mary Glover. Witness: John Levite

1769 Daughter Sarah

1771 Son John who died the same year (infant)

1773 Son Thomas. In 1784 Thomas Hoadley kept him for one week 6d.

1776 Daughter Elizabeth

1778 Son Richard

1781 Son William

1783 Son Edward

LEWES, Elizabeth

1780 Base son Joseph

LONDON, Jon and Mary

1779 They witnessed marriage between John Boakes and Sarah Couchman of Tonbridge.

LONG, Elizabeth

1726 (of Chiddingstone) married Thomas Bassett of Chiddingstone at the Fleet.

LONGHURST, John

1738 Death

LONGHURST, Daniel, glazier, son of John Longhurst above, wife Hannah

1739 to 1752 Occupied Chiddingstone-Cobham Courthouse, tenant of Streatfeild.

1746 Daughter Hannah

1749 Son Daniel

1752 Daughter Sarah

1754 Daughter Philly who married William Cackett in 1778. Witnesses: Joseph Austen, Sarah Richards.

1767 (senior) Death, aged 50. (monument in churchyard).

LONGHURST, Daniel, glazier, born 1749 (above)

1779 to 1782 Occupied Chiddingstone-Cobham courthouse, tenant of Streatfeild.

1784 He sent a bill for 2s to the overseers. 1785 Another bill for 7s 5½d.

1805 Death, aged 57 (monument in churchyard). (continued)

LONGHURST, Frances

1768 (widow) Death

LONGHURST,, David

1778 Witnessed marriage of John Virgo and Elizabeth Gainsford

LONGLEY, alias WOODGATE, John

1722 On the death of John Woodgate of Chiddingstone (Will PCC) his lands in Chiddingstone, Hever, Cowden, Lingfield and Rotherfield were left to his natural son Thomas Longley alias Woodgate

1724 to 1759 John Woodgate alias Longley owned Truggers (Hoath farm) in Chiddingstone.

1743 John Woodgate of Lewes, mercer, leased to John Taylor of Hever Hoath Farm and Geers with 140 acres.

1759 John Woodgate heretofore known as John Longley late of Hastings, now of Lewes, mercer, sold Hoath farm and Geers to Henry Streatfeild.

LONGLEY, John, wife Elizabeth

1743 Son Benjamin

1748 Son John

1753 Daughter Ann who married James Carden of Colsden in Surrey. Witness: James Jewell

1756 Son William

1759 Son Richard who died in 1764

1764 Daughter Elizabeth

1778 He or his son witnessed marriage of George Longley and Elizabeth Whale

LONGLEY, George, wife Mary, Elizabeth

1759 George Longley married Mary Rolls. Witness: Robert Mercer

1760 Son George who died in 1762

1764 Daughter Katherine

1778 (widower) He married Elizabeth Whale. Witness: John Longley

1779 Son Thomas

1781 Son William

1783 He received 11s relief. In 1785 he received much more relief. His rent was paid to Joseph Langridge, £2-10s.

LONGLEY, John, junior, wife Hester

1770 Daughter Ann

1785 He kept Mary Pollard's child for 18 weeks and Hurrion's child for one month. Some relief.

LONGLEY, William

1785 He supplied the workhouse with flax £1-17s.

LOVELAND, John

1749-1773 He occupied Woodsgrove at Coopers Corner, tenant of John Bassett.

1754 Nominated to be borsholder of Kings Borough.

LUCAS, Frances

1785 Frances Lucas, spinster, married Joseph Brown of St Giles, Camberwell.
Witnesses: William Haynes?, Amy Chambers?

LUCKIN, Robert

1768 Martha Hoskins leased lands which appear to include Brooks to Robert Luckin for 21 years.

1768 to 1786 Tenant to Hoskins for Brook farm, mostly in Brasted. Succeeded by John Luckin.

LYDWELL, John, a stranger

1737 Death

LYNN, John, of Seal, barber, wife Elizabeth

1769 His wife Elizabeth inherited a farm in Chiddingstone from her father Thomas Harbrow.
