1735 Will (PC) To kinsman John Niccoll £5. To kinswoman Hannah Fletcher a bed. Residue to George Fletcher of Penhurst, butcher. Witnesses: John Waite, Thomas Wells, Samuel Arnold.

NICHOLS. Thomas

1768 One of the constables of the hundred of Somerden. Fined £1 for not appearing at the quarter sessions to do those things which to his office appertain.

NICHOLS, James, wife Katherine

1777 Daughter Ann

1779 Daughter Katherine

1781 Son James

NIGHTINGALE, John, wife Jane

1734 Occupied Harborough or Moorfields farm near Bowbeech , tenant of Thomas Harborough.

1750 Deaths of John and Jane Nightingale

1788 to 1791 He occupied Harborough or Moorfields farm, tenant of heirs of Thomas Harborough. He succeeded Robert Nightingale. He also inherited Slaters farm from his father but aliened three parts to his brothers Robert, William and Thomas, keeping a fourth part. (manor of tyhurst)

1778 William Nightingale, bachelor, married Mary Russell of Penshurst. Witnesses: Thomas Russell, Elizabeth Russell

NORRIS, Mary, of Chiddingstone, spinster

1742 Married John Jenner, of Chiddingstone, bachelor, at the Fleet.

NORRIS, Ann, of Chiddingstone, spinster

1742 Married Thomas Taylor of Sevenoaks, mason, bachelor

NORTHEY, Thomas, gent, citizen and apothecary, wife Deborah

1709 Thomas Northey nominally transferred the ownership of his farm Vexour in Penshurst and Chiddingstone to his proposed wife Deborah as her jointure.

1733 Mrs Northey for Vexour (Church Repairs)

1752 Death of Thomas Northey of London, apothecary. Will (PCC). He left Vexour to his daughter Deborah.

1764 (Thomas) Northey being seized of 4 acres of land in West Chested Mead is dead. Deborah Northey was his daughter who alienated the same to Thomas Harvey, esq. (manor of Chiddingstone-Burghersh)

NORTHEY, Deborah, of St Pauls, Covent Garden, spinster

1752 She inherited Vexour from her father.

1761 She sold Vexour to Thomas Harvey of Tonbridge for £1800.
