Childrigstone and Hever parishes. Stuford Borough Protably belonged to the major of Hever Brozas but as it belonged to the look of the major it does not appear in the records.

There are three fields named upper tribble and Lower-Wilkins. As they are erticity within childrightone the property must have included the form Annis fields to be partly in Hever.

Pocuments concerning Lock Species before 1712 show that Luck Skinners included fields named Wilkins (four fields), kickefield and Corescoft or Culverroft in all 16 acres. This land cannot be the same as Wilkins above.
