The Will of WILLIAM ROBINSON of Tenterden in the County of Kent, husbandman, 26 June 1625. To my son William Robinson all my husbandry tools, a bed furnished, one acre of wheat next to the wood in a field containing four acres, and 20s. If he be not satisfied but claim £10 which I partly promised him, then he shall have but 10s. of the above bequest, the rest to be given to my wife Constance. To my daughter Eales Wilverden 6s. 8d., and to her two children John and Elizabeth Wilverden 4s. each. To my daughter Lidia Robinson £5 at her age of twenty-one or day of marriage, and if she die before said age, reversion to my son William and my wife Constance, equally divided. The residue of my goods and chattels to my wife Constance, whom I make my executrix. Witnesses: Nathaniel Tilden,* William Glover, John Huckstepp, and Robert Haffinden. Proved 3 June 1626 by the relict and executrix named in the will. (Archdeaconry of Canterbury, vol. 65, fo. 163.)
