They had seven children, 1803-1816, born at Croydon and Blackburn and Hartfield, Sussex, England. He married 2) Katherine Wickenden in England in 1818. They had four children, 1819-1825. Family members immigrated to the United States in the 1830s. Descendants listed, to ca. 1906, lived in New York, Michigan, California and elsewhere.

1876 Ernest Joseph Chart son of Frederick John Chart & Adelaide Chart was married to Mabelle I Swartz at four o'clock Tuesday afternoon November 6 1906 in Otsego by Rev. John Fletcher

Thirty years before on same day and hour the parents of the bride were wed

In the persecution of the protestants in the time of Queen Mary we read that one of the learned assistants of Tyndale in translating the Bible was John Fry. He was burned to death at Smithfield in 1552

One of the stories current among the descendants of John Fry, was to the effect that one of his sisters went with him to a place of worship. It was nine miles off and they walked there. Long before light in winter a voice could be heard at the young girl's door "Sister it is market day"

On market day every body had something especially good to eat in those country towns. Ah! But this meant food for the soul and those dear young Christians started off, perhaps in the rain, with a glow in their hearts, which nothing could guess of. They made one rest on the way. It was at a barn where they held a little prayer meeting especially to plead that God would keep back the mob or the police from breaking up the meeting. His religious zeal never flagged

1748 Robert Fry born 1748 was a blacksmith. Successful in business he left every one of his large family enough to set them up in business

He had in his possession, a table which had come down to him from his martyr ancestors. The top of the table could be made to stand perpendicularly. Across the lower part of this was a strap and back of this was a bible. In the last persecution of the Protestants this bible was used in family worship while a child was stationed at the window to give notice if any one came to the house.

If any one came the top of the table was turned down so that they could not be convicted of the crime of reading the Bible

Robert Fry's name was written in it.

One of the grand daughters used to stop with her grandfathers when all his children were married, and she said he would stop working in his garden long enough to sit on a bench under a pear tree, and take up his beloved Bible and look so happy. The death scene has often been related to me. He was eighty four. His neighbours who loved him came to see him, one after another. To each one he had something beautiful to say

Two of them were sceptics, both of them were converted at this dying bed. A light came out from his face which astonished everyone that came into the room. Said his pastor "I have come to hear you preach, you can not come to me. The room was crowded with friends. The room duf? Light from the face, and the triumphant voice called out "Sing Martha sing." "What shall I sing Father?" "O sing Worthy the Lamb that died" they cry. To be exalted thus

Worthy the Lamb our lips reply For he has died for us.

Mary ann's mother was a beautiful singer. She raised her voice but before the verse ended the happy spirit was perhaps finishing the song with the Hosts above.

1748 Robert Fry had a large family of children. Of the girls your grandmother was the oldest Mary Ann's mother the youngest.

There was my grandmother, Aunt Hughes & Aunt Mills. I saw her when I was five years old, a lovely woman and also I saw Uncle Thomas Fry who lived at Tunbridge Wells, a dear kind man, who would carry me whenever we came to a hill though I told him I was a big girl and had two little brothers.

Besides that there was John & Michael who were drafted into the war and never heard from afterwards. The English always notify the families when any are killed and grandfather always hoped that the had been taken prisoners on some American cruiser.

Of the Chart side I know very little. I have heard Mother say that her grandmother was a noble old lady. Except Aunt Shoesmith I never saw any of the family. She was a larger woman than Susie Chart, but I always thought Susie looked like her. One of the sweetest women I ever saw, such an expressive face, the color coming and going as she talked.

So far as I know these all died in the faith. Truly we can say "Lord thou hast been our dwelling place in all generations."

Great, great grandfather Robert Fry also dissenter very intelligent & religious had bible fastened under table. Uncle Josiah had it.

## Homes

Groombridge the home of the Canfields is ten miles from Tunbridge Wells, a fine brick house Elizabethan style, with moat filled with water still surrounding it, where are fine terraced gardens and a chapel dating from 1625 having a curious clock — one hand on face, up in gable end of chapel. Within the works are skeleton and the long pendulum swinging nearly to the floor. The churchyard is full of fine Canfield tombs.

Mary Canfield who married Henry Woodhams in 1781 must be our great great grandmother.

Bolebroke is in Hartfield not far from Groombridge. Was a fine old moated house now partly in ruins, but one wing – a three story brick still occupied. The towers are now used for hops and stables

William Woodhams my great great grandfather lived there 1¼ miles toward Ashurst church and Top Hill Stone Cross 1½ miles from Groombridge- are not far away. I think Henry & Mary were supposed to live at Top Hill and great great grandfather at Stone Cross. Ashurst churchyard full of Woodhams grave.

Woodhams crest "A buck's head? between two sprigs of roses all proper. Gules – chevron between three roses.

See Chambers Encyclopedia under Heraldry for the meaning of the terms in the description.

Motto – Welch – translated "We tread on none and are trodden on by none."

Coat of arms of the founders of Wadhams College Oxford is "I am a rose, I am a shell."

Col Wadhams US Navy told me the name was spelled Woodhams
