

Henry Isted, 1746

In the Name of God Amen I Henry Isted of the parish of Worth in the County of Sussex Yeoman being of Sound and Perfect Mind and Memory do make and declare my last Will and Testament in manner following (that is to say) I give devise and bequeath unto unto (*sic*) my Loving wife Angle (*sic*) Isted all my Estate both reall and personall ready Money plate debts Goods and Chattels whatsoever and wheresoever which do now or at the time of my decease shall belong or appertain to me And I do hereby make ordain and appoint my said wife Angle Isted full and sole Executrix of this my Last Will and Testament And do hereby revoke all former Wills Codicills and bequests by me at any time heretofore made written or spoken and do make publish and declare this to be my Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto Sett my hand and Seal the fourteenth day of January in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Thirty Eight – Henery Isted – Signed Sealed Published and declared by the said Testator Henry Isted as his Last Will and Testament in the presence of us who in his presence and at his request sett our Names as Witness hereto – William Leigh – Thomas Isted – John Davies –

The Will of Henry Isted of the parish of Worth within the Archdeaconry of Lewes was proved on the sixteenth day of April One thousand seven hundred and forty six before the Reverend Mr George Garnett Clerk Surrogate and so forth upon the Oath of Angle Isted the sole Executrix in the said Will named to whom the Administration of the Goods etc was Committed being first sworn well and faithfully to Administer the same and so forth
