

Will of Ann Duplock, Spinster of Lambeth 1837

PROB 11/1927/145

Will made 15 February 1837, probate 7 May 1840

In the name of God Amen I Ann Duplock Spinster now living with Mrs Catherine Van Mildert No 8 York Row Kennington Road in the Parish of Lambeth in the County of Surrey Do make this my Last Will and Testament First commending my Soul into the hands of my Creator and my body to the Grave in the hope of a joyful resurrection through the merits of my Blessed Redeemer Jesus Christ And as to my worldly affairs I first request of my Executor hereinafter named to discharge all my just debts funeral expences and the expence of proving this my will And whatever is left not otherwise disposed of I give and bequeath to my Sister Elizabeth Huntley Widow residing at Rutherford in Sussex. And I give and bequeath all my wearing apparel to my two Nieces daughters of the said Elizabeth Huntley the eldest named Elizabeth Richardson Wife of William Richardson living at Mayfield Sussex the youngest named Ann Peters Wife of William Peters living at Sevenoaks Kent to be equally divided between them as they shall agree but should my said Sister Elizabeth Huntley die before me I then give and bequeath my whole Property not otherwise disposed of to be divided equally share and share alike between my said Nieces Elizabeth Richardson and Ann Peters And I nominate constitute and appoint my great nephew John Simmonds Chiemist and Druggist in the City my Executor to this my last Will and Testament and give and bequeath to him the sum of thirty pounds for the trouble he will have in executing this my last Will and Testament Dated this fifteenth day of February one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven - Ann Duplock

Signed sealed published and declared by the said Ann Duplock the Testatrix as and for her last Will and Testament in the presence of us who in her presence at her request and in the presence of each other thereunto subscribed our names as witnesses
