I William Peerless Carpenter of the Parish of Speldhurst in the County of Kent do hereby give & bequeath unto my dear Wife Elizabeth Peerless all my property or such property as I shall die possessed off of every description or denomination howsoever called or known & whatsoever being and laying at the time of my decease for her sole use and benefit I do hereby declare this to be my last Will and Testament made the twenty eighth day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty four and signed Sealed and declared by me – *William Peerless X* – Signed Sealed and declared to be the last Will and Testament by ~~?? ?? ?? ?? ?? ??~~ the above named William Peerless in our presence and in the presence of each other the day of the date above written who at his request have sett our names as witnesses hereto – *James Hartridge – William Davis*

In the Goods of William Peerless deceased

Appeared Personally William Davis of Langton Green in the Parish of Speldhurst in the County of Kint Smith and made oath that he is one of the subscribed Witnesses to the execution of the last Will and Testament of William Peerless late of the Parish of Speldhurst in the said County of Kent bearing date twenty eighth day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty four now hereunto annexed and the deponent further made oath that the said Testator on the twenty eighth day of January aforesaid duly executed the said Will by making his mark at the foot or end thereof in the presence of James Hartridge the other subscribed Witness thereto and of this deponent both of whom were present at the same time and thereupon the said James Hartridge and this deponent attested and subscribed the said Will in the presence of the Testator and of each other and the deponent having viewed the words and names written under the mark or signature of the said Testator to wit 'Executors James Peerless & William Peerless' he further made that the said wried words were written by the deponent after the execution of the said Will by the said deceased – *William Davis* -

On the 7th day of May 1846 the said William Davis was duly sworn to the truth of this affidavit.
